Steps to Obtain a U.S. Visa

Request a Certificate of Eligibility (I-20)

Once you have been admitted to Penn State Lehigh Valley and confirmed your admission offer by paying your acceptance fee, you must apply for your Penn State I-20. You will receive an email with instructions from international@psu.edu. This email will be sent to you once a month until you complete your request for a Penn State I-20. Apply for a U.S. Visa

A visa allows you to travel to a U.S. port-of-entry and request entry. You must have your Penn State I-20 and an F-1 visa to request entry into the U.S.

Canadian and Bermudian citizens are visa exempt, but they must obtain an I-20, pay the SEVIS fee and show the receipt of payment at the port-of-entry.

- 1. F-1 students must pay two fees:
 - SEVIS I-901 Fee: The SEVIS fee https://fmjfee.com/i901fee/index.html can be paid in one of three ways. We recommend paying the SEVIS fee online for immediate receipt of payment. Print the receipt for your records.
 - Visa Application Fee (also called MRV fee): Payment for the visa application fee varies among
 the U.S. consulates. Payment is through a local bank which will issue a receipt with receipt number.
 For specific instructions on payment requirements, see https://www.usembassy.gov to find the U.S.
 consulate where you will apply for the visa.
- 2. Complete the visa application (DS-160) https://ceac.state.gov/genniv/ and print the DS-160 confirmation page with the application ID number after you submit online. For more information, please review https://travel.state.gov/content/travel/en/us-visas/study.html
- 3. Schedule the visa appointment. For information on making an appointment, see the U.S. consulate post's instructions at https://travel.state.gov/content/travel/en/us-visas/visa-information-resources/list-of-posts.html
 - You will need the DS-160 application ID number, the MRV receipt, passport number, and the SEVIS ID number to make an appointment.
 - Attend the visa appointment with the following: DS-160 confirmation page with the application ID number, the MRV (visa application) fee receipt, printed I-20 or DS-2019, photo, and valid passport.
 - Additional documents may be requested. Check the instructions and be prepared with all the documentation.

Preparation for Arrival to Penn State Lehigh Valley

Tuition and Billing

As an international student, it is important to familiarize yourself with tuition cost and how to pay your tuition and fees before your arrival to the United States.

Penn State partners with Flywire to streamline the tuition payment process for international students. Flywire offers excellent foreign exchange rates, allowing you to pay in your home currency and save a significant amount of money. Health Insurance

International students and their accompanying dependents must submit proof of health insurance that meets specific criteria or purchase the Student Health Insurance Plan (SHIP). More information about SHIP can be accessed at https://studentaffairs.psu.edu/requirements-international-students

Alternate plans must be filed with the Pennsylvania Department of Insurance or be a sponsored plan that meets waiver standards and is approved by the Penn State Student Health Insurance Office accompanied by a letter of financial guarantee directly from the plan sponsor.

Immunization

Penn State Lehigh Valley requires you to complete immunizations before arriving to the United States. This is very important and must be completed before arriving to Penn State Lehigh Valley. Off-Campus Housing

Committing to studying in a foreign country is exciting; however, there are key items that must get completed before or soon after you arrive in the United States. Finding a place to stay is one of those important items that must get done. Penn State Lehigh Valley **does not** have dormitory on campus. However, we have many safe and convenient off-campus housing options nearby campus. Penn State Lehigh Valley has partnered with Places4Students, a service that assists students with the search for off-campus housing accommodations, finding roommates, and posting student sublets.

Plan for Departure

Before making travel arrangements, please refer to the checklist on page 4 for information on when you are expected to arrive on campus to comply with visa regulations. Finalize your communication plans with family and friends, emergency plans, and other travel-related items. Remember that you may not enter the United States more than 30 days prior to the start of your I-20.

Consider attending an EducationUSA pre-departure orientation in your home country as part of final preparations to depart for the United States. During the orientation, EducationUSA advisers and students who have returned from their U.S. studies provide information and resources that will prepare you for new experiences as you focus on strategies to adjust to new challenges. When travelling to the U.S., keep your passport (with visa), admission letter, I-20, and financial documents in your carry-on bag or personal item. You will need to access these documents during your travel. DO NOT put these documents in your checked luggage.

While on the airplane, you should receive a U.S. Customs Declaration card. There should be instructions in the

airline magazine on how to complete the card. You must declare cash in the amount of \$10,000 or more.

Upon arrival at the U.S. port-of-entry, present the following documents to the Customs and Border Protection (CBP) Officer:

- Passport with valid and appropriate visa
- Printed I-20
- Customs Declaration Card
- Financial documents

The I-94 (Arrival/Departure Record) is an electronic document proving your legal entry and status, which is retrieved from https://i94.cbp.dhs.gov/194/#/home. Select "GET MOST RECENT I-94". For certain applications in the U.S., an I-94 will be required as evidence of legal status, so it is recommended that you print the electronic I-94 after your arrive to the U.S. See the I-94 Fact Sheet at https://www.cbp.gov/sites/default/files/assets/documents/2016-Mar/i-94-automation-fact-sheet.pdf

Travel and Transportation from Philadelphia International Airport

New international students have the option to fly into many surrounding airports such as Philadelphia International Airport, Newark International Airport, etc.

It is your responsibility to arrive on campus for our first in-person event on Wednesday, August 20th. Therefore, it is recommended that you plan your arrival to Penn State Lehigh Valley campus prior to this date. Unfortunately, there are not that many options to arrive on campus via train or bus and therefore it is recommended you look into the following options.

Taxis

Taxis can be picked up in Zone 5 of the International Philadelphia Airport at the Commercial Transportation Roadway by baggage claim area.

No student will be excused from or allowed to take a final exam at a different time due to a booked flight. To be safe, do not book flights home or elsewhere until after the last day of final exams, which is December 19th, 2025.

New International Student Orientation and New Student Welcome

New International Student Orientation (NSO)

New Student Orientation dates will be between June and August the summer before you begin your fall semester at PSU-LV. You will receive an email and have access to your NSO task list mid to late April with steps to register for one of the New Student Orientation dates. If you are in the U.S., you can attend one of the in-person NSO dates. You will also be able to schedule an appointment with a PSU-LV adviser on Starfish to discuss your academic plan and enroll in courses for the fall semester.

In addition, there will be a **virtual NSO for international students** with more specific information important to new international students. This online/virtual orientation will be on:

Tuesday, August 19, 2025

NSO for International Students consists of three essential steps:

- STEP 1: Online Virtual Academic Advising and Course Selection
- STEP 2: Online Virtual New International Student Orientation (Tuesday August 19th, 2025)
- STEP 3: In-Person Arrival and Welcome on Campus

Penn State Global's Intercultural Programming, Trips, and Events

Penn State Global offers a variety of programs on campus, around the state, and regional trips to help you connect with other PSU students. Most of these opportunities are offered to you at no additional cost. Popular events and trips that happen every year include:

- New and Returning International Student Welcome: This event it usually held the first weekend after classes begin
 where students from Northeast Region campuses including Hazleton, Lehigh Valley, Schuylkill, Scranton, and WilkesBarre will visit Hershey Park and participate in activities to get to know one another. A Chocolate making experience
 and enjoy free time in the park.
- Global Engagement and Leadership Experience: This weekend's retreat brings domestic and international students together for a weekend where we explore different cultural and global perspectives. Students participate in a wide variety of thought-provoking activities and gain skills to be a global leader on their campus.
- Global Sustainable Action Weekend: Held at University Park in November and by using the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) as a framework, students can come and learn about different aspects of sustainability. If there is a particular SDG that you are passionate about, you can present a session about the topic.
- Day and Overnight Trips to cities including New York City, Philadelphia, Washington, D.C., Baltimore, and Boston: There are many historic cities along the Eastern Coast of the United States. Penn State Global sponsors bus trips to these cities where you can learn the cultural history and explore your own interests in each city.
- Cultural celebrations: We invite you to share aspects of your culture with the campus community. We host a wide
 variety of cultural celebrations including Lunar New Year, Holi, Diwali, Carnival, Ramadan and more. We can support
